PLEASE NOTE: Scholarships are offered through the Northshore Scholarship Foundation, a local nonprofit organization. The application form for these scholarships is called “The Northshore Scholarship Foundation Application” and is available **only Online** at www.ns-scholarship.org.

Applicants for these scholarships must reside within Northshore School District boundaries or be attending Northshore high schools on an approved waiver.

Applicants for the Les/Vista Anderson Memorial Scholarships may be high school seniors or graduates of Northshore high schools. Applicants who did not graduate but can show a Northshore high school as the last school of attendance are also eligible to compete for the Les/Vista Anderson awards.

Additional information and applications may also be found on the Northshore Scholarship Foundation website. The address is www.ns-scholarship.org.

It is acceptable to duplicate the application if applying for more than one foundation scholarship which asks for the same application information. Transcripts need not be official or sealed.

Grants available to applicants at all secondary schools

Les & Vista Anderson Memorial Vocational Tuition Assistance Grants. Several grants of \$2,000 will be awarded and will be eligible for a renewal for a second year of study if good progress is demonstrated in the first year of the grant. Applicants must show a serious intent to study in a one- or two-year program at a community college or vocational/technical school. The scholarship may also be used to support an apprenticeship. (*The grants are not to be used for community college if the educational goal is to transfer to a four-year college.*) Financial need will be a consideration. The scholarships are sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Northshore. Applicants may be current seniors or former students whose class has already graduated. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are required. Winners will be notified by May 1. For graduating seniors and qualifying former students, applications are due February 3, 2012 at a Northshore School District High School Counseling Office; for renewals, submitted to the Foundation by March 30, 2012.

Karen Ann Olson Forys, PhD Scholarship - The scholarship amount will be \$2,000. The scholarship will be awarded each academic year to one graduating senior from among Bothell, Inglemoor, Woodinville or the Secondary Academy for Success high school. The candidate must be accepted into an accredited college or university. The candidate must be pursuing a degree in either education or the performing arts. The candidate must demonstrate that he/she is a good citizen, has obtained a high school grade point average of at least 3.0 and provided service to school and/ or community. Financial need will be a primary consideration with a demonstrated willingness on the part of the candidate to earn a portion of the remaining school expenses that will be incurred obtaining their degree. Applicants should

use the standard scholarship application form posted on the Foundation website. Finalists will be interviewed by the scholarship committee of the Woodinville Rotary Club and will be notified of the time and place of interviews. The winner will be notified no later than May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at a Northshore School District High School Counseling Office.

Nick Jewett Memorial Baseball/Softball Scholarship. One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Candidates will have the potential to continue participation in baseball/softball at the college level. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at a Northshore School District High School Counseling Office.

Julian and Kay Karp “Emerging Scholar” Award – One scholarship of \$2,000 will be awarded. It may be used at either a two- or four-year college. The scholarship will be awarded to a student who has overcome significant obstacles in life and who, without encouragement or financial support, could find future education out of reach. Other criteria may include selfless contributions to those in need and impeccable citizenship. The nominee will probably, but not necessarily, be a “C” student. Students do not submit applications for this scholarship. The recipient will be selected from letters of endorsement or recommendation submitted by Northshore staff members. To nominate a student for this award, staff members should address a letter to the Julian Karp Scholarship Committee with information about the nominated student. Finalists for the award may be interviewed. The winner will be notified by May 1. Letters of recommendation and endorsement are due February 3, 2012 at a Northshore School District high school Counseling Office.

Pop Keeney Memorial Football Scholarship. One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded to a Northshore School District senior who excels at football and wants to play the sport at the collegiate level. The applicants must demonstrate skill, teamwork, leadership, humility, love of sports and academic ability to succeed in college. The applicants must play football from the “heart”. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at a Northshore School District High School Counseling Office.

Carl Knoll/Dean Worthington Memorial Business Scholarship. The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. The scholarship is sponsored by Northshore Rotary Club. Applicants must demonstrate interest in pursuing a career in accounting, finance, marketing or business management or a related business field. Financial need and service to the school will be considered as well as academic potential. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application. No letters of recommendation are required. Finalists will be interviewed by the Northshore Rotary Club Scholarship Committee and should be prepared to discuss business interests. Applicants will be notified of time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at a Northshore School District High School Counseling Office.

Robert C. Knowles Memorial Scholarship. A scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Criteria will include financial need. Applicants must have a sincere desire to continue education beyond high school. High school GPA will not be a primary consideration. Finalists will be interviewed by the scholarship committee of the Northshore Rotary Club and should be prepared to discuss financial need as well as provide information about the proposed course of college study. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at a Northshore School District High School Counseling Office.

Janet and Gordon Livengood Memorial Scholarships –No new scholarship will be awarded in 2012. The renewal winners will be notified by May 1. Applications for renewal of \$1,500 scholarships are due March 30, 2012 to the Foundation.

Grants available to applicants at all secondary schools

Dr. Frank Love Memorial Scholarship – The scholarship amount is \$1,500. Recipients are selected on the basis of current involvement in school and community service. Grade point average or academic standing will not be primary considerations. The intent is to emphasize that education is not an end in itself, but instead is a means by which people become contributing members of society. The scholarship may be used at a two-year or a four-year college. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. Candidates must select "community service" subject as one of four opportunities to express themselves. A letter of recommendation may be attached. Finalists may be interviewed. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at a Northshore School District High School Counseling Office.

Northshore Auto Technology Scholarship – The scholarship amount will be \$1,000. Two will be awarded to outstanding members of the Northshore Auto Technology program. Applicants need not submit applications, as the scholarship will be selected from the members of the Auto Tech program. The winner will be notified by May 1.

Paul Michael Roberts Memorial Music Scholarship – One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Applicants must be planning for a career in music. The scholarship may be used at a 2-year college, a 4-year college, or a specialized music school. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form and attach a student statement regarding career goals. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalists may be interviewed and will be notified of the time and place of the interviews. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at a Northshore School District High School Counseling Office.

John Stoutenburg Healthcare Services Scholarship. One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Candidates must be interested in entering the field of health care services, emphasizing a lifestyle of well being, fitness and treatments of a preventative nature. Fields of study should include, but not be limited to chiropractics, nutrition, physical therapy, acupuncture, or naturopathy. Financial need will be a consideration, in addition to academic achievement. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application. Letters of recommendation from persons in the candidate's intended field of study will be considered. Finalists will be interviewed and will be notified of the time and place for the interviews. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at a Northshore School District High School Counseling Office. The winner will be notified by May 1.

Grants available to Bothell High School applicants

Rudy and Inez Beckstrom Memorial Vocational Scholarship (Bothell). One scholarship of \$1,500 will be given. Candidates will have an intent to pursue occupational or vocational studies at a community college or vocational school. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Staff nominations for this award will also be accepted. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications and nominations are due February 3, 2012 at the Counseling Office at Bothell High School.

Bothell High School Alumni Scholarship (Bothell) – One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. The scholarship winner will be a senior committed to promoting spirit and pride at Bothell High School. Other criteria will include someone active in bettering the school and active in community involvement. Finalists will be interviewed. The finalists will be notified of the time and place of the interviews. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Counseling Office at Bothell High School.

Bothell High School Faculty Scholarship (Bothell) - One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. The Bothell High faculty will nominate and select the recipient, so applications are not needed. Criteria will include good citizenship, service to the school and financial need. The winner will be notified by May 1.

BJ Brown Memorial Scholarship (Bothell) The scholarship amount will be \$2,000. It will be awarded to a graduating senior at Bothell High School who has exhibited the following characteristics: always gives his/her best; is respectful and kind to all; demonstrates high academic achievement; is a loyal friend; and plans to attend a 2- or 4-year college with the ultimate goal of receiving a 4-year college degree. Candidates will be nominated by the senior class so applications are not needed. Finalists will be interviewed. The winner will be notified by May 1, 2012.

Shawn Gardner Memorial Scholarship (BHS and WHS Only) The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. Candidates will be current high school seniors who plan to pursue a career in counseling or some related "helping profession." On the scholarship application, students should include information about why they have decided to pursue a career in their chosen profession. Financial need will be a consideration. Finalists may be interviewed. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at either the Woodinville or Bothell high school counseling office. The winner will be notified by May 1.

Kiwanis Club of Northshore Allen Haynes Academic Scholarship (Bothell) The scholarship amount will be \$2,000. The scholarship is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Northshore. Criteria will include leadership and service to the school or community. Candidates must demonstrate potential for academic success. Active Key Club members are encouraged to apply. Financial need will be a consideration. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Winners will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Counseling Office at Bothell High School.

Northshore Rotary – Karen Forys Scholarship (Bothell) One scholarship of \$2,000 will be awarded. It is sponsored by Northshore Rotary Club. Academic achievement, service to others and plans to attend a four-year college will be criteria. Financial need is a consideration. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalists will be interviewed. Finalists will be notified of time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Counseling office of Bothell High School.

Lois and Vern Keener Memorial Vocational Scholarship (Bothell). One scholarship of \$1,500 will be given. Candidates will have an intent to pursue vocational studies at a community college or vocational school. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Staff nominations for this award will also be accepted. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications and nominations are due February 3, 2012 at the Counseling Office at Bothell High School.

Tom and Atha Lee Memorial Scholarship (Bothell) The scholarship amount will be \$2,000. The scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior at Bothell High School who struggled with academics early in high school, but who has made academic improvement in the junior and/or senior year and now has a sincere desire to continue education beyond high school. Students do not apply for this scholarship. The staff at Bothell High will nominate and select the recipient. The winner will be notified by May 1.

Northshore Rotary Academic Scholarship (Bothell) One scholarship of \$2,000 will be awarded. It is sponsored by Northshore Rotary Club. Academic achievement, service to others and plans to attend a four-year college will be criteria. Financial need is a consideration. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalists will be interviewed. Finalists will be notified of time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Counseling office of Bothell High School.

Kaysner-Rivergrove Memorial Scholarship (Bothell) One scholarship of \$1500 will be awarded. The major emphasis in selecting the scholarship winner will be based on community service to Bothell High School and/or the Northshore community. The Scholarship recipient will be a senior committed to furthering themselves through education and training in fields relating to but not limited to technology, the arts and/or musical interests. The scholarship may be used in any accredited technical, community college or four-year college. Financial need will also be a primary consideration. The Finalists will be interviewed. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation Application form. Applications are due February 3, 2012 to the Counseling Office at Bothell High School. No letters of application are to be attached. The Winner will be notified by May 1, 2012.

Richard Worthington, Jr. Memorial Good Citizen Award (Bothell). No new, renewable scholarship will be awarded. Applications for renewal for recipients of 2009, 2010 and 2011 are due March 30, 2012 at the Foundation address.

Grants available to Inglemoor applicants

J.P. Hennessey Memorial Music Scholarship (Inglemoor). The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. Candidates must have been involved in the music program at Inglemoor High School and plan to continue involvement with music after high school. The scholarship may be used at a four-year or a two-year college. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form and attach a student statement regarding career goals. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Candidates will be notified for interviews. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Inglemoor High Counseling Office.

Kiwanis Club of Northshore Si Siverson Academic Scholarship (IHS) The scholarship amount will be \$2,000. The scholarship is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Northshore. Criteria will include leadership and service to the school or community. Candidates must demonstrate potential for academic success. Active Key Club members are encouraged to apply. Financial need will be a consideration. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Winners will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Counseling Office at Inglemoor High School.

Chris Lin Memorial Scholarship (Inglemoor) – One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Interest in pursuing a career in music composition, creative writing, or musical performance will be primary criteria. Financial need, good citizenship and service to the school will be considered. A minimum GPA of 2.75 is required. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form and include a sample of writing or musical composition. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Inglemoor High School Counseling Office.

Philip Lorey Memorial Scholarship. The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. In the case of equally qualified candidates, preference will be given to candidates from Inglemoor High School. Candidates will be planning to pursue training and careers in teaching ministries, missions or Christian music. Applicants will demonstrate academic success that is indicative of success in college and be able to discuss educational goals and career commitment. Applicants should also be able to show evidence of a Christian service lifestyle. Finalists will be interviewed. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application and include a statement of personal faith and two personal references. Financial need will be considered. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at a Northshore School District High School Counseling Office. The winner will be notified by May 1.

Christina MacRae Memorial Scholarship, The T-Mac Award. A graduating senior at Inglemoor High School will be awarded a \$1500 scholarship. The candidate needs to attain a GPA of 3.2 or higher. Another requirement is to demonstrate participation in ASB Activities including student leadership, school activities and/or sports. Demonstrating a commitment to their community through community service involvement in the Northshore area as a local volunteer will also be a criteria for selection. The selection process may involve an interview of finalists for the award. Use the standard

Northshore Scholarship application. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Inglemoor High School Career Center. The winner will be notified by May 1.

Northshore Rotary – Karen Forys Scholarship (Inglemoor) One scholarship of \$2,000 will be awarded. It is sponsored by Northshore Rotary Club. Academic achievement, service to others and plans to attend a four-year college will be criteria. Financial need is a consideration. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalists will be interviewed. Finalists will be notified of time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Counseling office of Inglemoor High School.

Northshore Rotary Academic Scholarship (Inglemoor) One scholarship of \$2,000 will be awarded. It is sponsored by Northshore Rotary Club. Academic achievement, service to others and plans to attend a four-year college will be criteria. Financial need is a consideration. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalists will be interviewed. Finalists will be notified of time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Counseling office of Inglemoor High School.

J.R. Suarez Memorial Scholarship (Inglemoor) - One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Candidates will be graduating seniors from Inglemoor High School who plan to pursue higher education after graduation. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form including a description of the person who has been the biggest inspiration in your life and why. Also explain how the lessons learned from this inspiring role model are manifested in your life each day. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Inglemoor High School Counseling Office.

Grants available to Secondary Academy for Success (SAS) applicants

Northshore Rotary S.A.S. Scholarship One scholarship of \$2,000 will be awarded. It is sponsored by Northshore Rotary Club. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. The winner will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the S.A.S. Counseling Office.

Woodinville Rotary Make a Difference Scholarships (SAS and WHS ONLY). The scholarship amount will be \$7,500 if attending a four-year school, or \$3,500 if attending a two-year program. The scholarship is sponsored by Woodinville Rotary Club. Criteria will include academic achievement, service to others, and evidence of acceptance to a qualifying college. Selection will be based on the applicant's demonstrating that he or she would not be able to attend college without a scholarship that covers a substantial portion of tuition, books and fees. **The recipient will attend a Washington state-operated, two- or four-year institution of higher learning.** Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalist interviews will be conducted. Finalists will be notified of the time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Woodinville High School or SAS counseling offices.

Grants available to Woodinville High School applicants

Shawn Gardner Memorial Scholarship (BHS and WHS Only) The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. Candidates will be current high school seniors who plan to pursue a career in counseling

or some related “helping profession.” On the scholarship application, students should include information about why they have decided to pursue a career in their chosen profession. Financial need will be a consideration. Finalists may be interviewed. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at either the Woodinville or Bothell high school counseling office. The winner will be notified by May 1.

Peg Phillips Memorial Theater Arts Scholarship (WHS ONLY) The scholarship amount is \$1,500. It will be awarded to a student who has been active in the drama program at Woodinville High School and who has volunteered or interned with the Woodinville Repertory Theater. The scholarship must be used at a two- or four-year accredited theater arts college, conservatory or university. An application entitled “The Peg Phillips Memorial Theatre Arts Scholarship Application” is available in the Career Center at Woodinville High School. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Counseling Center at Woodinville High School. The winner will be notified by May 1.

Doug Pride Memorial Scholarship (WHS Only) - The scholarship for 2012 is available only to the 2010 and 2011 recipients who are eligible for renewal at \$2,000 each. Conditions for renewal will include maintenance of a 3.0 GPA in college and declaration of a major within a time frame that will permit university graduation within four or five years of study. Renewal candidates will be pursuing majors in architecture, business administration, engineering, veterinary medicine, science or teaching. The GPA must be at least 3.0 and candidates must be U.S. citizens. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation renewal application form and include most current transcript available. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Applications for renewal are due March 30, 2012, submitted to the Foundation. It is the responsibility of the recipient to apply for renewal as notice is provided by the Foundation.

Woodinville Rotary Club Scholarship (WHS Only) – The scholarship amount will be \$3,500 and will be awarded to an outstanding graduate of Woodinville High School, based on the student’s service to school and community, for academic performance and potential, and for financial need. The candidate should have attained a GPA of 3.25 or greater and **plans to attend either a public or private four-year college or university within the state of Washington**. Finalists will be interviewed by the Scholarship Committee of Woodinville Rotary Club and will be notified of the time and place of interviews. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form available on the Foundation’s website. Winners will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Woodinville High School Career Center.

Woodinville Rotary Make a Difference Scholarships (WHS and SAS ONLY). The scholarship amount will be \$7,500 if attending a four-year school, or \$3,500 if attending a two-year program. Several scholarships are available. The scholarship is sponsored by Woodinville Rotary Club. Criteria will include academic achievement, service to others, and evidence of acceptance to a qualifying college. Selection will be based on the applicant’s demonstrating that he or she would not be able to attend college without a scholarship that covers a substantial portion of tuition, books and fees. **The recipient will attend a Washington state-operated, two- or four-year institution of higher learning.** Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalist interviews will be conducted. Finalists will be notified of the time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 1. Applications are due February 3, 2012 at the Woodinville High School or SAS counseling offices.

Grants available at Cascadia Community College

Anderson Vocational Scholarship for Cascadia Community College The scholarship is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Northshore and given in memory of Bothell residents Les and Vista Anderson. It is available to a current Cascadia Community College student or a graduating high school

senior who intends to enroll at Cascadia Community College (CCC). The \$2,000 scholarship may be renewed for an additional year if recipient maintains a 2.0 or higher cumulative GPA. Students must (1) be or plan to be enrolled in 10 or more credits at CCC, (2) have a 2.0 or higher cumulative GPA in high school or college, (3) maintain a residence in or have attended high school in the Northshore School District (Woodinville, Bothell, or Inglemoor High Schools or the Secondary Academy for Success), and (4) be pursuing a 2-year degree preparing for a vocational or occupational career path. Preference is given to students who demonstrate financial need. Applications are due April 23, 2012 at Cascadia Community College Foundation (2nd Floor, Administration Offices, 281E).
