Jerry Wilmot Memorial Masters of Business Scholarship – The scholarship amount is \$2,500 and is for a candidate accepted or enrolled in the Masters of Business program at UW Bothell. The selection is made through interviews in August of the selection year for academic year 2015-16. Candidates should contact the Financial Aid office at UWB or the School of Business for criteria, eligibility and for appropriate application procedures and deadlines.

Marv Workman UW Bothell Business Scholarship — The scholarship amount is \$2,000 and is available to a full-time student in his or her junior year who has been admitted to or is currently enrolled in the Business program at University of Washington Bothell. Preference will be given to graduates of secondary schools within the Northshore School District or current residents of the Northshore School District and to students who have completed lower-division studies at the University of Washington Bothell or will transfer from co-located Cascadia Community College or another Washington state community college. The scholarship is available for academic year 2015-2016 and is renewable for a second year if the recipient is on a track to complete degree requirements during that academic period. In addition to having achieved a strong academic record, candidates shall have been active in service to community and school. Financial need will be given strong consideration. Application details will be posted in February at the University of Washington Bothell. Finalists will be interviewed by a committee selected by the sponsoring Woodinville Rotary Club and the Workman family

Pat Matthews Masters of Education Scholarship at UW Bothell — The scholarship amount is \$2,500 and will be awarded to a woman accepted in the Masters of Education program at the University of Washington Bothell with the intent of securing a teaching certificate or of obtaining credentials which would further her career in teaching or education administration. The scholarship is renewable for a second year, depending on the recipient's satisfactory progress toward securing a degree. Candidates will hold an undergraduate degree and will have had at least two years teaching experience. Those who reside within or are employed by the Northshore School District may be given priority in the selection process. Financial need is a primary consideration and candidates will be asked to discuss their activities related to service to others in their field and in their community. Application details will be posted in February at the University of Washington Bothell. Finalists will be interviewed by a scholarship committee comprised of members of the Matthews family and the Kiwanis Club of Northshore.

Anderson Tuition Assistance Grant – The \$2,000 scholarship is renewable for a second year of studies at Cascadia. It is not, however, designed for a student planning on following a path for transfer to a four-year institution.

Northshore Rotary Club Cascadia Scholarship — The \$2,000 scholarship is offered by the Northshore Rotary Club and its account with the Foundation.

Woodinville Rotary Club Make a Difference Scholarship – The \$2,000 scholarship is meant for a student who, without financial help, would likely not be able to attend college. It is offered by the Woodinville Rotary Club through its annual fund raising efforts.
