NORTHSHORE SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION

PLEASE NOTE: Scholarships are offered through the Northshore Scholarship Foundation, a local nonprofit organization. The application form for these scholarships is called "The Northshore Scholarship Foundation Application" and is available only Online at www.ns-scholarship.org.

Applicants for these scholarships must reside within Northshore School District boundaries or be attending Northshore high schools on an approved waiver.

Applicants for the Les/Vista Anderson Memorial Scholarships may be high school seniors or graduates of Northshore high schools. Applicants who did not graduate but can show a Northshore high school as the last school of attendance are also eligible to compete for the Les/Vista Anderson awards.

It is acceptable to duplicate the application if applying for more than one foundation scholarship which asks for the same application information. Transcripts need not be official or sealed.

Grants available to applicants at all secondary schools

Les & Vista Anderson Memorial Vocational Tuition Assistance Grants

Several grants of \$1,500 will be awarded and will be eligible for a renewal for a second year of study if good progress is demonstrated in the first year of the grant. Applicants must show a serious intent to study in a one- or two-year program at a community college or vocational/technical school. The scholarship may also be used to support an apprenticeship. *(The grants are not to be used for community college if the educational goal is to transfer to a four-year college.)* Financial need will be a consideration. The scholarships are sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Northshore. Applicants may be current seniors or former students whose class has already graduated. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. On the back page of the application the applicant should include a personal statement of his/her interest in continuing education in the selected field as well as a statement about a person who influenced him/her. No letters of recommendation are required. Winners will be notified by May 15. For graduating seniors and qualifying former students, applications are due March 1 at the Counseling Office; for renewals, submitted to the Foundation by March 30.

Carl Knoll/Dean Worthington Memorial Business Scholarship. The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. The scholarship is sponsored by Northshore Rotary Club. Applicants must demonstrate interest in pursuing a career in accounting, finance, marketing or business management or a related business field. Financial need and service to the school will be considered

as well as academic potential. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application. No letters of recommendation are required. Finalists will be interviewed by the Northshore Rotary Club Scholarship Committee in April and should be prepared to discuss business interests. Applicants will be notified of time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office.

Rusty Young Community Leadership Award. One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded to a Northshore School District graduating senior who has displayed a strong record of service to community as well as leadership at school and has a cumulative GPA of 3.0. The scholarship is sponsored by Northshore Rotary Club and applicants will be interviewed by the Northshore Rotary Club. Selection will be based on academic potential and financial need. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application. Applicants will be notified of time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office.

Pop Keeney Memorial Football Scholarship. One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded to a Northshore School District senior who excels at football and wants to play the sport at the collegiate level. The applicants must demonstrate skill, teamwork, leadership, humility, love of sports and academic ability to succeed in college. The applicants must play football from the "heart". Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office.

Betty Stoutenburg Memorial Art Scholarship. One scholarship of \$1,000 will be awarded. Candidates will be seniors who demonstrate achievement, talent, and an interest in pursuing a career in art. Selection will be based on artistic achievement and financial need. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application and submit a portfolio of no more than 10 slides or works that depict the student's abilities. Attach at least one letter of recommendation from a visual arts instructor and a personal statement from the student of his/her intentions to study in the visual arts field. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office.

Steven Haynes Memorial Fine Arts Scholarship. One scholarship of \$1,000 will be awarded. Candidates will have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and test scores which indicate ability to complete college level studies. Evidence of distinguished performance in the Fine Arts, Performing Arts, or Visual Arts will be criteria. Portfolios are encouraged but not required. Use standard Northshore School District Scholarship application. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office.

Nick Jewett Memorial Baseball/Softball Scholarship. One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Candidates will have the potential to continue participation in baseball/softball at the college level. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office.

Bob and Ruth Munro Memorial Scholarship. One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Applicants must have a minimum 2.8 GPA and be able to demonstrate financial need. Other considerations will include good citizenship, good attendance and service to the school or community. Special consideration may be given to students with an interest in the aviation trades, either flight or maintenance. In addition to current seniors, employees of Kenmore Air Harbor may also apply. Plans to attend college in the state of Washington are preferred. The scholarship may be used at either a 2-year or 4-year college. Finalists will be interviewed and will be notified of the date and time for interviews. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the high school Counseling Office or at Kenmore Air Harbor.

John Stoutenburg Healthcare Services Scholarship. One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Candidates must be interested in entering the field of health care services, emphasizing a lifestyle of well-being, fitness and treatments of a preventative nature. Fields of study

should include, but not be limited to chiropractics, nutrition, physical therapy, acupuncture, or naturopathy. Financial need will be a consideration, in addition to academic achievement. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application. Letters of recommendation from persons in the candidate's intended field of study will be considered. Finalists will be interviewed and will be notified of the time and place for the interviews. Applications are due March 2 at the high school Counseling Office. The winner will be notified by May 15.

Janet and Gordon Livengood Memorial Scholarships –One new scholarship of \$2,000 will be awarded which may be renewable for an additional three academic years. Financial need will be a primary consideration. The scholarship may be used at either a community college or a four-year college. Other criteria to be considered are school/community activities, student leadership, work experience and grade point average. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalists will be interviewed in April. Recipients of scholarships in 2004, 2005 and 2006 are eligible to have their awards renewed. The winners will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the high school Counseling Office. Applications for renewal are due March 30 to the Foundation.

Jan Allott Liberal Arts Scholarship – One new scholarship of \$2,000 will be awarded to a Northshore School District graduating senior who intends to follow a course of study in the liberal arts at a four-year institution. Candidates should display interest in the fields of social work, the humanities or social sciences. A GPA of 3.0 is required and a record of service to school and community will be considered along with financial need. Finalists will be interviewed and will be notified of the time and place of interviews. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the school Counseling Office.

Paul Michael Roberts Memorial Music Scholarship – One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Applicants must be planning for a career in music. The scholarship may be used at a 2-year college, a 4-year college, or a specialized music school. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form and attach a student statement regarding career goals. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalists may be interviewed and will be notified of the time and place of the interviews. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the high school Counseling Office.

Julian and Kay Karp "Emerging Scholar" Award – One scholarship of \$2,300 will be awarded. It may be used at either a two- or four-year college. The scholarship will be awarded to a student who has overcome significant obstacles in life and who, without encouragement or financial support, could find future education out of reach. Other criteria may include selfless contributions to those in need and impeccable citizenship. The nominee will probably, but not necessarily, be a "C" student. Students do not submit applications for this scholarship. The recipient will be selected from letters of endorsement or recommendation submitted by Northshore staff members. To nominate a student for this award, staff members should address a letter to the Julian Karp Scholarship Committee with information about the nominated student. Finalists for the award may be interviewed. The winner will be notified by May 15. Letters of recommendation and endorsement are due March 2 at a Northshore high school Counseling Office.

Richard Hart Memorial Scholarship. One scholarship of \$750 will be awarded. Candidates must attend Bothell United Methodist Church. The scholarship is not limited to applicants who live within the Northshore School District. Contact Bothell United Methodist Church for application information and any additional criteria.

Northshore Auto Technology Scholarship – The scholarship amount will be \$750. It will be awarded to an outstanding member of the Northshore Auto Technology program. Applicants need not submit applications, as the scholarship will be selected from the members of the Auto Tech program. The winner will be notified by May 15.

Dr. Frank Love Memorial Scholarship – The scholarship amount is \$2,000. Recipients are selected on the basis of current involvement in school and community service. Grade point average or academic standing will not be primary considerations. The intent is to emphasize that

education is not an end in itself, but instead is a means by which people become contributing members of society. The scholarship may be used at a two-year or a four-year college. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. Candidates must select "community service" subject as one of three opportunities to express themselves. A letter of recommendation may be attached. Finalists may be interviewed. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the high school Counseling Office.

Northshore Teacher Education Scholarship. The scholarship is sponsored and funded by the Woodinville Rotary Club. The amount of the scholarship is \$1,500 and is open to graduates of all Northshore School District high schools. Applicants must demonstrate interest in pursuing a career in education. Financial need and service to the school will be considered as well as academic potential. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalists will be interviewed by the Woodinville Rotary Scholarship Committee and should be prepared to discuss their interest in pursuing a career as a teacher, preferably in the fields of math or science. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office.

Franklin Adams Ability Award. The scholarship amount will be \$1,000. It will be awarded to a senior who is living with significant physical challenges and wants to pursue education beyond high school. Challenges may include, but not be limited to, cerebral palsy, muscular dystrophy, blindness, multiple sclerosis etc. The minimum GPA will be 3.2. In the case of equally qualified candidates, preference will be given to a student at Bothell High School. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form, but it is not required to complete the essay portion of the form. No letters of recommendations are to be attached. Finalists will be interviewed. Applications are due March 2 at the high school counseling office. The winner will be notified by May 15.

Darren Lindal Memorial Aviation Scholarship. The scholarship is for \$600 and will go to a person desiring to obtain a private pilot's or instructor's license. The candidates are enrolled in a basic flight-training program at a certified flight school or those who can show evidence of planned enrollment. The candidate may also apply to have the funds used for advance pilot training such as instrument flying. Financial need will be considered. Use the specific Northshore Scholarship Foundation form for the **Lindal grant.** Graduates may contact the Scholarship Coordinator of the Northshore Scholarship Foundation. Deadline for applications for the 2007 scholarship is March 2 at the Counseling Office or the Foundation. The winner will be notified by May 15.

Robert C. Knowles Memorial Scholarship. A scholarship of \$2,000 will be awarded. Criteria will include financial need. Applicants must have a sincere desire to continue education beyond high school. High school GPA will not be a primary consideration. Scholarship recipients may have an opportunity to renew the award for additional years of study. Finalists will be interviewed by Northshore Rotary Club and should be prepared to discuss financial need as well as provide information about the proposed course of college study. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the high school Counseling Office.

Philip Lorey Scholarship. The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. In the case of equally qualified candidates, preference will be given to candidates from Inglemoor High School. Candidates will be planning to pursue training and careers in teaching ministries, missions or Christian music. Applicants will demonstrate academic success that is indicative of success in college and be able to discuss educational goals and career commitment. Applicants should also be able to show evidence of a Christian service lifestyle. Finalists will be interviewed. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application and include a statement of personal faith and two personal references. Financial need will be considered. Applications are due March 2 at the high school counseling office. The winner will be notified by May 15.

Malinowski-Marston Communications Scholarship. The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. Candidates will have an interest in pursuing a career in print communications (excludes broadcasting, advertising, and public relations careers). Financial need, academic potential and

seriousness of purpose are considerations. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Candidates will be interviewed by the Communications Scholarship Committee of Woodinville Rotary Club and should be prepared to take work samples to the interview. Applicants will be notified of time and place of interview. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the high school Counseling Office or the Foundation.

Blakely/Love Superintendent's Merit Scholarship. One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. The award will go to the Northshore National Merit Finalist with the highest SAT scores who is not receiving a scholarship from the National Merit Scholarship Corporation. The scholarship is supported by Kiwanis Club of Northshore. Candidates need not submit applications. Each high school will submit the name of its candidate no later than May 1. The scholarship winner will be notified by May 15.

Marv Workman Business Scholarship for Incoming UWB Freshman. The club will provide a \$2,000, renewable scholarship, to a graduate who has been accepted at University of Washington-Bothell as a freshman in the fall of 2007 and who desires to seek a degree in the UW-B business program. Funds provided by the Woodinville Rotary Club. Applicants are to use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. (All Northshore graduates may apply but primary consideration will be given WHS candidates). Finalists will be interviewed by the Scholarship Committee of the Woodinville Rotary Club. Winners will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office or the Foundation office.

Cascadia Community College Scholarship – The scholarship amount is \$1,750. It will be awarded to (1) a Northshore student graduating in 2007 who plans to continue education after high school at Cascadia Community College, or (2) to a graduate of a Northshore high school presently attending Cascadia, or (3) to an earlier graduate of a Northshore high school who intends to enroll at Cascadia. The scholarship is available to students pursuing a two-year degree or who are interested in transferring to a four-year school. The scholarship is sponsored by Northshore Rotary. Financial need will be a primary consideration. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalists will be interviewed. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office of the high school the applicant presently attends or formerly attended. The winner will be notified by May 15.

Grants available to Bothell High School applicants

Richard Worthington, Jr. Memorial Good Citizen Award (Bothell). One scholarship of \$3,000 will be awarded. The criteria will include school/community service, good citizenship and good attendance. A GPA of 3.2 and a strong academic program is required. Financial need will be considered. The scholarship may be renewable for an additional three academic years. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office at Bothell High School. Applications for renewal are due March 30 at the Foundation address.

Kathleen Sanford Memorial Teaching Scholarship (Bothell) – The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. It may be used at a 2-year or 4-year college or university. Criteria will include a sincere intent to pursue a career in K-12 education, good citizenship, good attendance, service to the school or community and a minimum 3.0 GPA. Financial need may be a consideration. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation Application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. On the back page of the application applicants should include information about their interest in pursuing a career in education. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office at Bothell High School.

Lois and Vern Keener Memorial Vocational Scholarship (Bothell). One scholarship of \$1,200 will be given. Candidates will have an intent to pursue vocational studies at a community college or vocational school. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office at Bothell High School.

Rudy and Inez Beckstrom Memorial Vocational Scholarship (Bothell). One scholarship of \$1,200 will be given. Candidates will have an intent to pursue occupational or vocational studies at a community college or vocational school. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office at Bothell High School.

Bothell High School Faculty Scholarship (Bothell) - One scholarship of \$2,000 will be awarded. The Bothell High faculty will nominate and select the recipient, so applications are not needed. Criteria will include good citizenship, service to the school and financial need. The winner will be notified by May 15.

Bothell High School Alumni Scholarship (Bothell) – One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. The scholarship winner will be a senior committed to promoting spirit and pride at Bothell High School. Someone who promotes the well being and fellowship of classmates. Other criteria will include someone active in bettering the school and community involvement. Finalists will be interviewed. The finalists will be notified of the time and place of the interviews. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office at Bothell High School.

Tom and Atha Lee Memorial Scholarship (Bothell) The scholarship amount will be \$1,750. The scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior at Bothell High School who struggled with academics early in high school, but who has made academic improvement in the junior and/or senior year and now has a sincere desire to continue education beyond high school. Students do not apply for this scholarship. The staff at Bothell High will nominate and select the recipient. The winner will be notified by May 15.

Northshore Rotary Academic Scholarships (Bothell) Two scholarships of \$1,500 each will be awarded. They are sponsored by Northshore Rotary Club. Academic achievement, service to others and plans to attend a four-year college will be criteria. Financial need is a consideration. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalists will be interviewed in April. Finalists will be notified of time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling office of Bothell High School.

Kiwanis Club of Northshore Allen Haynes Academic Scholarship (Bothell) The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. The scholarship is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Northshore. Criteria will include leadership and service to the school or community. Candidates must demonstrate potential for academic success. Active Key Club members are encouraged to apply. Financial need will be a consideration. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Winners will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office at Bothell High School.

Shawn Gardner Memorial Scholarship (WHS and BHS Only) The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. Candidates will be current high school seniors who plan to pursue a career in counseling or some related "helping profession." On the scholarship application, students should include information about why they have decided to pursue a career in their chosen profession. Financial need will be a consideration. Finalists may be interviewed. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Applications are due March 2 at the Woodinville or Bothell high school counseling office. The winner will be notified by May 15.

Grants available to Inglemoor High School applicants

J.P. Hennessey Memorial Music Scholarship (Inglemoor). The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. Candidates must have been involved in the music program at Inglemoor High School and plan to continue involvement with music after high school. The scholarship may be used at a four-year or a two-year college. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form and attach a student statement regarding career goals. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Candidates will be notified for interviews. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Inglemoor High Counseling Office.

Inglemoor High School Memorial Scholarship (Inglemoor). The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. Service to the school, academic potential and financial need will be criteria. Special consideration may be given to candidates active in drama or music. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Inglemoor High School Counseling Office.

J.R. Suarez Memorial Scholarship (Inglemoor) - One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Candidates will be graduating seniors from Inglemoor High School who plan to pursue higher education after graduation. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form including a description of the person who has been the biggest inspiration in your life and why. Also explain how the lessons learned from this inspiring role model are manifested in your life each day. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Inglemoor High School Counseling Office.

Chris Lin Memorial Scholarship (Inglemoor) – One scholarship of \$1,500 will be awarded. Interest in pursuing a career in music composition, creative writing, or musical performance will be primary criteria. Financial need, good citizenship and service to the school will be considered. A minimum GPA of 2.75 is required. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form and include a sample of writing or musical composition. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Inglemoor High School Counseling Office.

Northshore Rotary Academic Scholarships (Inglemoor) - Two scholarships of \$1,500 each will be awarded. They are sponsored by Northshore Rotary Club. Academic achievement, service to others and plans to attend a four-year college will be criteria. Financial need is a consideration. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalists will be interviewed in April. Finalists will be notified of time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling office at Inglemoor High School.

Kiwanis Club of Northshore Si Siverson Academic Scholarship (IHS) The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. The scholarship is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Northshore. Criteria will include leadership and service to the school or community. Candidates must demonstrate potential for academic success. Active Key Club members are encouraged to apply. Financial need will be a consideration. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Winners will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Office at Inglemoor High School.

Philip Lorey Scholarship. (Primarily Inglemoor) The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. In the case of equally qualified candidates, preference will be given to candidates from Inglemoor High School. Candidates will be planning to pursue training and careers in teaching ministries, missions or Christian music. Applicants will demonstrate academic success that is

indicative of success in college and be able to discuss educational goals and career commitment. Applicants should also be able to show evidence of a Christian service life style. Finalists will be interviewed. Use the standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form and include a statement of personal faith and two personal references. Financial need will be considered. Applications are due March 2 at the high school counseling office. Winner will be notified by May 15.

Grants available to Woodinville High School applicants

Woodinville Rotary Academic Scholarships (WHS ONLY). The scholarship amount will be \$1,500. Four scholarships will be awarded. The scholarship is sponsored by Woodinville Rotary Club. Criteria will include academic achievement, service to others, and plans to attend a four-year college. Financial need will be considered. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Finalist interviews will be conducted in April. Finalists will be notified of the time and place of interviews. Winners will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Woodinville High School Counseling Office.

Woodinville Rotary Leadership/Service Scholarship (WHS ONLY) The scholarship amount is \$1,500. The scholarship is sponsored by Woodinville Rotary Club. Criteria will include school/community service and leadership. Financial need will be a consideration. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. The winner will be notified by May 15. Applications are due March 2 at the Woodinville High School Counseling Office.

Marv Cook Memorial Scholarship (WHS ONLY) The scholarship amount is \$1,500. The recipient will be a graduating senior from Woodinville High School who is currently enrolled in AP Calculus at Woodinville High School or has already completed AP Calculus at Woodinville High School. Use standard Northshore Scholarship Foundation application form. No letters of recommendation are to be attached. Winners will be notified by May 15. Applications are due on March 2 at the Woodinville High School Counseling Office.

Peg Phillips Memorial Drama Scholarship (WHS ONLY) The scholarship amount is \$1,500. It will be awarded to a student who has been active in the drama program at Woodinville High School and who has volunteered or interned with the Woodinville Repertory Theater. The scholarship must be used at a two- or four-year accredited theater arts college, conservatory or university. An application entitled "The Peg Phillips Memorial Theatre Arts Scholarship Application" is available in the Career Center at Woodinville High School. Applications are due March 2 at the Counseling Center at Woodinville High School. The winner will be notified by May 15.
